A young mother is shot to death; her family seeks answers and justice

January 24, 2019 Detroit, MI. Asia Nash was discovered shot and killed on Sunday, May 21, 2017 at approximately 4 a.m. Her body was found in the area of Sloan St and W. Jefferson on Detroit's south west side.

According to family, Asia left home around 3 p.m. to spend time with friends. Asia and her friends would later arrive at a party; during that party, Asia left with an unknown male and was never seen or heard from again. Her body was found in a vacant lot by a passer-by.

Asia was educated in the Detroit Public Schools system. After school, Asia became a proud mother to a daughter named Skye. Asia had dreams of one day opening her own female run mechanic shop as she had a strong interest in the field. She was a self-proclaimed "foodie", and attended Greater Cooper Memorial Church in Detroit. Asia Nash was only 24 years old.

Crime Stoppers of Michigan is offering a cash reward of up to \$2,500 for information that leads to an arrest for the murder of Asia Nash. All rewards are paid anonymously.

Through diverse community outreach programs across Southeast Michigan, CSM works to build stronger, safer communities by encouraging people to actively embrace social responsibility. The CSM tip line (1-800-SPEAK-UP) was created for citizens to anonymously report information about a crime. As an incentive, tipsters can receive a cash reward if their information leads to an arrest. A cash reward of up to \$2,500 is paid for an unsolved homicide, hit and run fatality or endangered missing person. A cash reward of up to \$1,000 is paid for all other crimes. In the last five years, Crime Stoppers has received more than 28,000 anonymous tips from the public and has awarded more than \$450,000 in cash rewards to anonymous tipsters.
